





















## Name 3 things you would want to CHANGE about Downtown Overbrook

- 1. More shops. More food. Better use of space.
- Less empty buildings and that embarrassing purple house
- 3. Curb appeal,

- 5. Improve visibility by not letting people park at the far edge of Main Street. If you're trying to enter Main, it can be hard to see traffic.

Also, a handicap accessible sidewalk entrance in front of the library so we can add a crosswalk from the library to the post office since that is where most people (and kids) are actually crossing the street. That's four things, whoops. Here are more: update the pole banners! Spend some dough on beautification! Add a fountain, create a place people want to rest in and admire. There is literally so much space to do this in. Like, maybe a public park in the lot by the clinic and the oak plaza apartments. Elderly people can take their dogs there (I currently see them just walk them up and down the sidewalk outside their apartments) and it could be a nice outdoor area. Oh, and also, I hear all the time about the old events downtown like Oktoberfest, street dancing, etc. Maybe we could invest some money into community events?
