Recreational fires are hereby ordered* discontinued in the Cities of Bellevue, Beaux Arts Village, Clyde Hill, Hunts Point, Medina, Newcastle and Yarrow Point.



ALLOWED

Manufactured portable outdoor devices

- barbeques and patio warmers used in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions

Approved fuels in appropriate device -

charcoal, natural gas or propane gas

* By Order of the Fire Code Official, pursuant to Washington Administrative Code Section 173-425-050 (3) upon consideration and input received from the Northwest Interagency Coordination Center (<https://gacc.nifc.gov/>). This Order shall be complied with by the owner, operator, occupant, or other persons responsible for the condition or violation to which the Notice and Order pertains.



NOT ALLOWED

All Recreational Fires – any outdoor fire such as a backyard fire pit or campfire using chopped firewood or charcoal

Any person found with a recreational fire who fails to take immediate action to extinguish or otherwise discontinue such burning when ordered or notified to do so shall be charged with a misdemeanor. (IFC 109)

Recreational fires are restricted until this order is lifted or unless otherwise permitted by law enforcement or authorized agencies.
