- The owner must obtain a rental business license by completing a rental license application and listing all rental properties.
  - Each LLC, LLP, individual, trust etc., will have its own application with Properties matching Assessors record in that name.
- Renter must obtain and complete a Rental Inspection Application and a Owner Exit Agreement received from city hall or owner / manager of property.
  - Application must be signed by owner / manager.
- The property address will be checked to see if it is registered as a rental.
  - If not registered an inspection will not be performed.
- Current code violations of the applicant and owner of property at the address will be checked.
  - If violations on either are found an inspection will not be performed until violations are corrected.
- A signed lease in Applicant's name needs to be turned in with application and copied.
  - If no lease, an inspection will not be performed.
- A signed Owner Exit Agreement
  - Only if moving from a rented property in the City of Kennett.
  - If no agreement, an inspection will not be performed.
  - \* Identification will be verified against signature with an ID. \*
- When all conditions are met, the \$50 inspection fee will be paid.
  - Applicants must be informed to notify the owner / manager that utilities must be on for an inspection to be performed.
  - If utilities are not on, an inspection will not be performed.
- Advise applicant that code enforcement will make contact within 24 hours to schedule an appointment for the Entry inspection.
  - Advise applicants that the inspector must be allowed access to property and will not be responsible for keys or property security.
  - No persons allowed inside residence during inspection.
- Upon completion of inspection the applicant will be notified of a pass or fail result.
  - If property fails, the applicant may obtain a copy of the inspection results to give to the owner / manager to address the code violations to make the property *HABITABLE*.

- Applicant, owner, or manager must contact code enforcement when repairs are completed to make an appointment for 2nd inspection, free of cost.
  - If property fails the second inspection 2nd inspection, the owner is responsible for the \$50 fee for the 3rd inspection.
- When property passes, Kennett Board of Public Works will be notified by code enforcement that property passed and utilities can be put in the applicant's name.

\*The utilities must be in the Applicants name\*
