# Water Well Updates!!!

Funding – On Tuesday, November 21, we received word from the Texas General Land Office that the City of Burton has been awarded \$593,800.00 of the Regional Mitigation Fund. This money will be used to drill the secondary water well that the city has needed since 2013. This is fantastic news to celebrate! Woo-hoo! However, this grant will only cover a portion of the actual cost of the water well. So, we will need to continue to pursue additional funding to cover the rest of the cost of the well... along with the additional much needed water line upgrades down the north end of Main Street and up FM 1697 (where the water lines continue to break).

Addition Funding Being Sought – Presently, we are waiting for a grant to open with the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB). We are seeking additional funding via the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) where we can seek funding with belowmarket fixed interest rates. There is also an opportunity for Burton to qualify for principal forgiveness because we are a "very small system" and have "an urgent need". Mayor Karen has already been researching what demographic information is needed for the application process and found that Burton needs *YOU* to help the TWDB update their data! She has put in a request with the TWDB to have a third-party community survey be done for the town. Right now, we are awaiting word for that approval.

**How You Can Help** – *Should* the city receive permission from the TWDB to do a third-party survey, we would ask that when the surveyor comes by that you answer his questions as truthfully and honestly as possible. **IF** we are allowed to do this survey, you will receive a letter from the City of Burton regarding information about the firm, the surveyor, the dates he will be visiting, as well as what kinds of demographic questions he will be asking. Until then, **NO ONE** will come to your door regarding a survey on behalf of the City of Burton.

**AMPSS Application** – In late September, Mayor Karen submitted an application with the TWDB to participate in the Asset Management Program for Small Systems (AMPSS) for both the water well system as well as the wastewater system and treatment plant. This program will help the City of Burton "achieve long-term sustainability and make

managerial/operational decisions that utilize the resources of the system as efficiently as possible". We await word for admission to this program.

# **Buzzard Management**

By now, you have heard or read that the City of Burton is engaged in an aggressive bird management campaign focused on the removal of buzzards here in town. This is a two-phase approach.

Phase One is already underway. We have asked *all* businesses and entities who use dumpsters for trash disposal – whether they are used for food disposal or not - to keep their lids closed at all times.

Phase Two involves a wildlife biologist with the Texas Wildlife Services. This is the "aggressive" part of the bird management. It is a two-stage process that begins with pyrotechnics (flashes and booms) and ends with lethal removal of the stubborn and undeterred. This is a 3-5 day process, taking place mostly an hour before sundown. Should the wildlife biologist need to address issues on private property, he will contact the landowner.

Please know that the city will do our best to let you know when the process will begin so that you can bring in any pets that might be afraid of loud booms (like fire crackers). This process will begin as soon as the paperwork is in order.

# **Washington County Hazard Mitigation Plan**

Every five years, the county's Hazard Mitigation Plan is reviewed and updated. Mayor Karen has been working with a team of county leaders to evaluate and update this plan, focusing specifically on the needs for the City of Burton. A community meeting to review this plan will be held on Thursday, December 14 from 6-7:30pm at the Washington County Expo Center at the Fairgrounds. You are invited to attend.
