Dear Cedarville Citizens,

The Cedarville City Council passed Ordinance 2020-06-16-01 which submits to the voters of Cedarville in the November 3 election, the question to deannex, also referred to as detachment, two tracts of territory currently in the City limits and transferring those two tracts back to the County.

The first tract is Mill Pond Road from the intersection with Hightower Road east approximately .8 of a mile to the county line. Hightower Road would also return to the county. Mill Pond Road from Highway 59 to Hightower Road will remain in the City limits. See Attachment 1.

The second tract is Creekside Way from Highway 59 approximately .23 of a mile southwest to the county line. See Attachment 2.

Mill Pond Road serves only four 911 addresses of City residents and Hightower Road serves one. The vast majority of people using Mill Pond Road are not Cedarville residents. Mill Pond requires extensive City time and resources to maintain due to the steep terrain and high traffic use.

Creekside Way serves two 911 addresses of City residents. A low-water bridge at the end of the City limits crosses into the County and is used only by county residents to travel to their homes. During periods of heavy rain, this low-water bridge washes out, requiring the city to spend hours of time and loads of gravel to repair it. No Cedarville citizens live on the other side of this bridge.


Cedarville receives road maintenance money from the state based on city population. The City would rather use these limited funds to continue improvements on roads used predominately by the citizens of Cedarville.

The City requests you vote FOR detachment of the territory described in Ordinance 2020-06-16-01.
