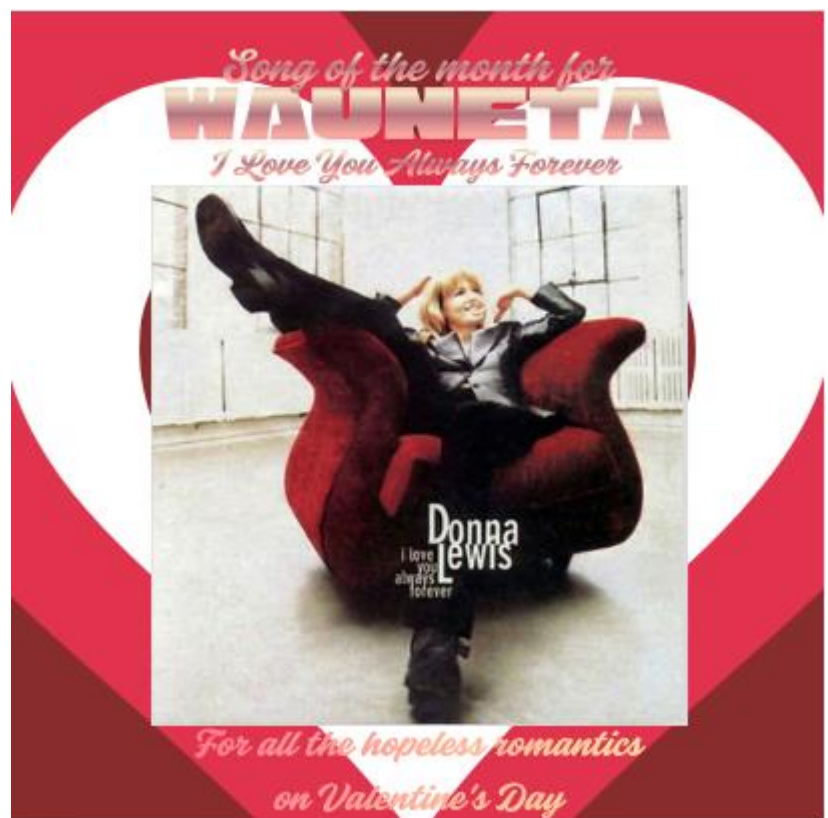

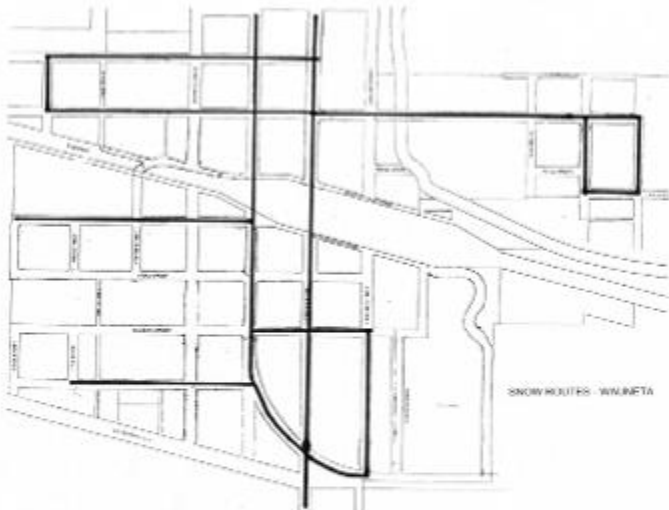

Slow-Cook Beef Burgundy

Ingredients:

6 bacon strips, diced
 1 boneless beef chuck roast (3lbs), cut into 1 ½ -in. cubes
 1 can (10. ½ oz.) condensed beef broth, undiluted
 1 small onion, halved and sliced
 1 medium carrot, sliced
 2 Tbsp. butter
 1 Tbsp. tomato paste
 2 garlic cloves, minced

¼ tsp. dried thyme
 ½ tsp salt
 ½ tsp pepper
 1 bay leaf
 ½ lb. fresh mushrooms, sliced
 ½ cup burgundy wine
 5 Tbsp. all-purpose flour
 ¾ cup cold water
 Optional: Hot cooked noodles and minced fresh parsley

Directions:

1. In large skillet, cook bacon strips over medium heat until crisp. Use a slotted spoon to remove to paper towels. In the drippings, brown beef; drain.
2. Place beef and bacon in a 5-qt. slow cooker, Add broth, onion, carrot, butter, tomato paste, garlic, thyme, salt, pepper, and bay leaf. Cover and cook on low until meat is tender, 7-8 hrs
3. Add mushrooms and wine. combine flour and water until smooth; gradually stir into slow cooker. Cover and cook on high for 30-45 minutes or until thickened. Discard bay leaf.
 If desired, serve with noodles and parsley.

Availability of the agenda was communicated in the publicized notice, and a current copy of the Agenda was maintained as stated in the publicized notice. All proceedings of the Board of Education, except as may be hereinafter noted, were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Mr. Geier shared the budget savings of 4% annually now that we operate only one building. Board members asked if considering a full day preschool program would be beneficial. It was noted that the AD/Transportation positions weren't filled this year and the board suggested that those be added back to increase administrator efficiency.

No policy updates at this time as we continue to work with Perry Law firm when legislation changes and warrants policy changes.

V.7. Personnel Update

The board discussed the implementation of a Personnel Survey for Climate/Work Place satisfaction and the Safe Say application.

The Board set the following goals: Addressing the Ag Shop to improve the structure with painting, exterior entry doors, and garage door repairs; and address the ADA parking at the football/track field near the new bleachers for improved access.

The Board would like to purchase a new/used coach bus to replace the old one and possibly a new/used suburban to the fleet.

VI.3. Curriculum Goals. None.

The board would like to have an updated phone system and sound system for the competition gym.

The board would like to consider a full-day preschool model to improve district efficiency.

VI.6. Policy Goals. None.

VI.7. Personnel Goals

The board would like to add the AD and transportation director position(s) to improve administrative efficiency, conduct a climate survey for all staff, and research the Safe Say application with benefits to the district.

Village of Wauneta, Nebraska

A meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Wauneta, Nebraska, was convened in open and public session at 6:30 p.m. on **January 13, 2026**, at the Wauneta Village Office.

Pledge of Allegiance was given.

Chairman Johnston publicly stated to all in attendance that a current copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was available for review.

Present: B Kramer, R Einspahr, P Johnston. Absent: C Walgren, K Kerchal.

Guests: Arlan Wine (Village Attorney), Deputy Mueller (Chase County Sheriff Dept), RaNae Richardson (WCTC Administrator).

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Imperial Republican on January 8, 2026. Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to the Chairman and all the Trustees. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Board approved the minutes of the regular meeting of the Village Board of Trustees, held on December 9, 2025.

Board approved Treasurer's Report (Dec 2025) and approved bills (Jan 2026) as presented.

Johnston, Einspahr and Richardson reviewed Nursing Home Financial Reports for Nov 2025 and the Committee Meeting Report with the Village Board. Board approved a wage increase for Gary Hunt, as recommended by Richardson.

Reviewed the December 2025 Sheriff's Activity Report with Deputy Mueller.

The Board discussed the Wastewater Lagoon and next steps for NDWEE facility compliance, which include financing and land acquisition.

Skelton gave the Board written notice that a vacancy will exist on the Village of Wauneta Board of Trustees in 2026. (Crystal Walgren has expressed her intent to resign from the Board). The length of the unexpired term will be until the end of December 31, 2026. Skelton will advertise the vacancy, and the Board shall address the issue of filling such vacancy at the next meeting.
