

I believe professionals network or collaborate well with other professionals in the community to best serve Goodhue County residents affected by the opioid crisis.	+50.6%
I believe my organization does a good job tracking opioid related data internally. ^b	+36%
I understand the scope of the opioid crisis in Goodhue County.	+25.9%
I believe community members in our community with lived experience are aware of existing resources for people affected by opioid use.	+28.3%
