# **ALUMNI & WISHEK NEWS**

- The Wishek Fire Department was seeking bids for the construction of a new fire hall.
- The South Border boys wrestling team defended its titles as the Class B dual and individual champions at the state tournament held at the Fargodome in February.
- Both the Ashley Tribune and the Wishek Star were advertised for sale as established and profitable newspapers in McIntosh County.
- The Wishek Public School Library Board updated the library over the past year—shelves were removed, new carpet was installed, and Tammy Rohweder painted two murals on the library walls.
- Dr. Eric and Paula Froehling, owners of Wishek Chiropractic Clinic, celebrated 30 years in business in April. Their daughter Isabella (2017) has joined her father as a practicing doctor of chiropractic at the clinic.
- Phillip Aipperspach (2010) joined the North Dakota Seed Department in April as the new Regulatory Manager.
- The 250mw Orsted Badger Wind Farm Project was well underway in May and was functional in early 2026 with 92 turbines supplying power to North and South Dakota as well as Montana.
- Airman First Class Connor Kosiak (2024) graduated Air Force basic military training (BMT) on May 8, 2025. A1C Kosiak completed his BMT at Lackland AFB. He completed Air Force technical training as a Remotely Piloted Aircraft Maintenance Specialist at Sheppard AFB and has returned to North Dakota as a member of the ND Air National Guard and resumed his studies at UND, majoring in Aerospace Engineering.
- The city of Wishek launched a new wishek-nd.com website. It contains lots of information and area photos. - The Wishek Tourism Committee's latest project was the restoration of the OshKosh B'gosh "ghost sign" that was painted on the south side of the Meidinger Store building in the early 1900s on Centennial Street.
- After 30 years as an insurance agent, Al Weigel retired as an agent for Farmer's Union insurance. He had offices in Napoleon, Steele, and Wishek.
- Parker Salwei was valedictorian and Levi Buchholz was salutatorian for the 10-member Class of 2025 in Wishek.
- Linda Stock retired as head custodian at the Wishek Public School in May.
- Levi Buchholz and Cole Stock, 2025 Wishek graduates, attended the 51<sup>st</sup> ND Shrine Bowl All-Star Football Game at Mayville State University on Saturday, June 21st.
- Airman First Class Charlie Herr (2023) graduated Air Force basic military training (BMT) on June 12, 2025. A1C Herr completed his BMT at Lackland AFB. He is attending Air Force technical training as a targeting analyst at Goodfellow AFB in San Angelo, Texas. Upon completion of his technical school, he will be returning to North Dakota as a member of the ND Air National Guard.
- The 99<sup>th</sup> Annual Tri-County Fair was held the second weekend of July.
- July 2025 marked two years since the disappearance of Jonett (Aberle) Wanner (1991) from her West Fargo home. The search for Jonett is ongoing.

They will continue to live in Fargo where Ryan works for KFGO and Tabitha is Health Information Management Director at PAM Health Rehabilitation Hospital of Fargo.
- North Dakota Leadership Seminar (NDLS) held their annual Summer X for alumni at Beaver Lake State Park this year. As part of the annual excursion, members chose a volunteer project that would benefit the area they visit. This year, ten NDLS members volunteered for a day to paint curbs yellow throughout the city. - Wishek Public School welcomed two new teachers in August. Laekyn Schwab, from Hazen and a Dickinson State graduate, is teaching second grade. Lauren Akers, from Fargo and a graduate of UM/Duluth, is teaching fifth grade.



- Wishek Fire & Rescue accepted a donation of \$25,000 from Orsted and the Badger Wind Farm to be used in helping fund the new fire hall.
- Tri-County Speedway season champions were Donavin Wiest (2000), Legends class, and Jodie Michaelsohn (1995), WISSOTA Street Stocks.
- At their regular meeting in August, Wishek American Legion Fred Kelle Post 87 members voted to sell their building because it's been draining the organization financially over the years. Alternative meeting locations have been discussed including the Wishek Golf Course clubhouse and the Wishek Senior Center.
- David and Chelsea Hagel purchased Blondies bar from longtime owners Mike and Lenora Jacobson. They renamed it Hagel Haus. The menu remains the same including Piccadilly Pizza.
- Farmers Markets were a big hit this past fall at the Civic Center Gazebo.
- Donielle Goodson became the new postmaster at the Wishek Post Office. She has worked in the postal system for twenty years and previously lived in Charlotte, NC.
- Greg Salwei (former faculty) was appointed to finish the remaining term of John Lake who resigned from the city council. Jim Weber (1974) was appointed to the Special Assessment Board for a six-year term. The board helps do the legwork for street projects in Wishek.
- The North Dakota Amateur Baseball Hall of Fame honored Dan Haugen (faculty), a second year Phy-ed teacher for Wishek Public School, for his outstanding contributions to the sport of baseball as an umpire.
- Resident and business owners were each assessed a dollar by the city council on their utility bill for mosquito spraying.
- Pastor Colin Neuharth, St. Luke Lutheran, accepted a call to Trinity Lutheran Church in Mitchell, South Dakota. A native of Eureka, SD, he had served as Pastor at St. Luke since August of 2022.
- Wishek Public School circulated a survey to gauge the public's interest in moving to a four-day school week.
- Old bound editions of the Wishek Star were relocated to the library from the former Ashley Tribune building.
- The Wishek School and Public Library now has a handicapped accessible door and a new sidewalk leading to the library.
- Gordon Dexheimer and his wife Brenda opened the doors to Dexheimer Law Office in October in the former Depuydt Law Office on Beaver Avenue.
- The 100th Sauerkraut Days celebration was held the weekend of October 10-12. There were many activities available for every age.
- The 54<sup>th</sup> Wishek Wildlife Buffalo Supper was held at the civic center on October 17<sup>th</sup>.
- A Planning and Zoning Commission was in the works for McIntosh County. There was a public hearing on the proposal. About 20 years ago, a planning and zoning ordinance was almost adopted. A reason for the resurgence of the zoning commission is the ongoing wind tower project.
