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STAFF SUMMARY REPORT

ITEM: Item #2: Water and Sewer Rates

MEETING DATE: September 9, 2021

The purpose of this meeting is to continue the discussion conducted on August 23, in preparation for the public hearing scheduled for September 14. Dan Jackson plans to be in attendance at this session to participate in the discussion and answer any questions.

At the August 23 special meeting, it was discussed that a move to volumetric rates could be accomplished in two phases:

PHASE I: COMMERCIAL RATES

- Commercial accounts would be changed to volumetric billing as of January 1, 2022. To accomplish this, a Resolution setting those rates will need to be adopted before December 1.
- Apartments with more than 4 units could be considered commercial for billing purposes.
- Vineyards (other than for home use) would be billed at commercial rates.

PHASE 2: RESIDENTIAL RATES

Council recognizes that the current billing system is problematic in that it encourages dishonesty and is difficult for staff to monitor and enforce. We can use experience gained from the switch to volumetric billing to develop a fair and equitable volumetric rate structure for residential users.

As is currently the practice, out of town users would be charged at a higher rate. Currently, rates for out of town users are between 14% and 25% higher, depending on the rate category. Council has discussed a 20% greater rate for out of town users under the new rate structure.

Issues to be considered and resolved prior to the switch for residential users include:

- Use of water for landscaping, which does not enter the sewer system. In the past, sewer rates have been calculated as a percentage of water charges.
 - John Knight did a bit of research and found that San Luis Obispo establishes a "sewer cap" for billing based on winter water usage. It seems that this could work well here. See the attached pdf for more information.
- Multiple residences being served by a single meter.

Ideally, the switch to volumetric billing for residential use would be accomplished within the next two years.

ALONG WITH PHASE I, AND APPLICABLE TO BOTH RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL:

• A "line maintenance charge" is being considered, based on the distance from the water meter to the point where our water enters the town. A "base distance" would be established wherein the charge would be nil or minimal, and there would be an added charge for each distance of 1,000 feet (or any portion thereof) beyond the base distance. This would be separate from the metered billing. We are currently working on measuring distances and will be able to provide more information about that soon.

The scenario discussed by Council was "1B," which includes 8,000 gallons of usage in the base rate. An excerpt of Mr. Jackson's report detailing that rate structure is attached here and shows its impact on both residential and commercial accounts for various levels of water consumption, as compared to current rates.

SEWER CAP/WINTER WATER AVERAGE

Winter Averaging Period

It's that time again! The Winter Averaging Period for the 2020-2021 year is approximately <u>December 4 through March 9</u>. Your usage during this period will determine your sewer cap for the 2021-2022 year, so make sure to turn off your irrigation! During these months the days are shorter, the weather is typically cooler, and there is more moisture in the air. Even in years where there is less rain than usual, using these months is still the best measurement we have of calculating your average impact on the sewer system. For more information on drought related impacts on winter water use, see <u>Council Agenda Report</u> dated May 6, 2014 and <u>Resolution No. 10587</u>.

Winter Averaging Process

The City's sewer charges are directly tied to water usage. Each property is separately metered, and single family residences are restricted from having dedicated landscape meters; this can lead to irrigation costs registering for applicable sewer charges. To compensate for this difference in usage, the City instituted the Sewer Cap for residential customers.* Water usage is tracked from December through February when irrigation systems are likely off. The usage is averaged to determine the sewer cap applicable for the upcoming year.** For example:

December Usage (January Meter Read) 4 units

January Usage (February Meter Read) 5 units

February Usage (March Meter Read) 7 units = 16 units / 3 = 5.33

In this case, the Sewer Cap will be set at 5. Once the Sewer Cap is determined, it becomes effective July 1 of that year. This Sewer Cap will apply to the customer's account for the entire year, until the following July, when the new winter average will be established anew.

How it Works

The Sewer Cap sets the **maximum** that a customer will be charged for wastewater treatment (sewer) per month. The amount a customer is billed each month is based on their usage *up to* their cap. For example, using the sewer cap of 5 determined above:

Month	Units "Used"	Units Billed	Cost
August	5	5	\$47.20
September	7	5	47.20
October	4	4	37.76

Proposed Rate Plan Alternatives



- Scenario IA Uniform Rates No Minimum Volume
 - implements a volume-based uniform rate per 1,000 gallons with no monthly minimum volumes
- Scenario IB Uniform Rates 8,000 Gallon
 Minimum Volumes
 - implements a volume-based rate per 1,000 gallons for water customers; with 8,000 minimum gallons in base charge
- Both rate plans are designed to recover equivalent revenues
