


- Come Meet U.S Congressman Burgess Owens at Mayfield Town Hall Thursday October 3rd @ 11:30 AM - 12:30 PM

Mayor's Corner October 1, 2024

With the end of Summer and the beginning of Fall we are seeing the hot summer temperatures give way to cooler nights which will bring the beautiful fall colors. Fall Colors are beginning to appear on the mountain sides and will gradually move to the valleys as we move through this season of the year. We I hope you have had an enjoyable summer with family and friends.

A few items that we have accomplished this year throughout town.

- 1. The Lower 12 Mile Spring pumps programmed and working to supplement our upper springs and tanks. We have not used any of our wells or the water treatment facility.
- 2. We were able to chip seal the roads on the west side of town and the east side of the order. This is part of our road plan as we work to maintain the roadways.
- 3. The Lions Club supplied funding for concrete walks around the pickleball courts. The Town added a short sidewalk from the old tennis courts on the east to the park sidewalk. This will allow for access with strollers and wheelchairs to the park walkway.
- 4. We have applied for some grants for additional parking lot improvements at the west gravel parking lot near the west restrooms.
- 5. The Lions fund the lights at the pickleball courts which when first installed impacted the homes to the west lighting their backyards like day. We were a little slow in addressing this. We have lowered the angle of the lights to make some improvements.

We have a couple of items of concern that we need your help with.

- 1. We have kids ride their motorcycles, 4- wheelers and ATVs to the park. All entrances through The fence and gravel parking lots are for pedestrian traffic, not motorized transportation. Motorized transportations is prohibited from riding on the sidewalks and grass. Gravel parking lots and roads, around the pickleball courts, and the playground wood chip piles are not motocross areas. Parents, please instruct your children.
- 2. We all live in this small town, and we want everyone to have an enjoyable time. When you are at the park or having a home activity, please be considerate of the neighbors as you recreate regarding noise and music. When we recreate, we are only involved one or two days a week, but Please consider those around the park who live with the lights, noise and activity 7 days a week.
- 3. We have signs around the park that Dogs are not allowed in the park similar to community parks all cities. It becomes a health issue when dogs are allowed to defecate on the grass, and it is left for others to step in or run over with the lawn mowers.
- 4. We periodically receive complaints regarding dogs barking in town. Please remember that you are responsible to train your dog and to keep it controlled.
- 5. We are receiving regular complaints regarding speeding in town. It has occurred on the sideroads as well as the main roads in town and on the Canyon Road. It is motorcycles, ATV's, and vehicles. We have seen traffic traveling at 40 to 50 mph in the 25 mph zones, even 60 mph on the canyon road and 65 to 70 mph in a 40-mph section on Highway 137 going north. If we don't see a significant reduction in speeding and stop sign violations, you will force us to hire police to monitor and issue tickets. The worst tragedy would be an accident with someone injured or killed.

By choosing to live in a town or travel on the highways, we all agreed to live by the rules in place at the time. There is no reason or excuse for breaking laws that would justify an injury or death. Many times, I used the following phrase to remind myself I need to; "slow down and smell the roses". Another way would be to "slow down and wave at your neighbor", or better yet, "stop and get to know someone new in town". Thank you for all for being the great people we have in Mayfield and have a wonderful fall.
